All children learn at different times and different rates.



Communication and Language Listening and Attention, Understanding Speaking

The children will be learning to:

- talk confidently and clearly
- show awareness of listener
- enjoy listening to stories, songs and poems, showing good attention
- follow instructions
- answer questions about stories






Phonics

Phase 1: Awareness of Sounds

- Rhyme: The ability to hear rhyme is a very important early reading skill e.g. play rhyming games, continue a rhyming pattern (made up words), songs and rhymes
- Alliteration: awareness of sounds e.g. I spy, Silly Soup (slugs, snails, sausages, slime)

Oral blending/Segmenting: Robot talk e.g.
 d-o-g = dog





Phonics Phase 2

- Daily phonics lesson to teach sounds Jolly Phonics/Letters and Sounds
- Teach a new sound each day e.g. SATPIN
- · Learning styles Picture, Actions, Song

- PURE SOUNDS mmmmm not muh!
- Blending using sounds to read words
 e.g. s-a-t = sat (sit, pin, tap, pit, nip, tin)
- Segmenting words e.g. sat = s-a-t

TRICK WORDS e.g. the



Phonics

Phase 3 and 4


- Digraphs: 2 letters that make 1 sound e.g. shop, chip, thin, ring, rain, feet, boat, farm.
- Trigraphs: 3 letters that make 1 sound e.g. dear, fair, light.
- Alphabet names


Phase 5 - end of YR/Y1

Alternatives e.g. rain, play, make






Reading

- Trick Word list


Tired children - try in the morning or word lists





Writing

- Through the children's interests and play we will encourage <u>mark making</u> and <u>writing</u> at every opportunity e.g. map to find the pirates treasure or poster to catch the robber.
- Stages of writing
 - Emergent writing e.g. scribbles, letter shapes
 - Initial sounds e.g. s (snake)
 - Initial and final e.g. s......c
 - Then some sounds in the middle e.g. s ai c
 - Sound buttons
 - TRICK WORDS e.g. the, was, my, said,
