It was lovely to see so many friends and family at the start of this week at the drop in sessions to look at the children's work. The children loved sharing their learning with you and we hope you enjoyed the experience.

Multi Skills Competition

Congratulations to the Year 1 and 2 children who represented St Martin's at the Multi Skills competition at Park House School on Tuesday. They did an amazing job, demonstrating our school values and working together as a team, and they all came away with a gold medal! Thank you to Mrs Burke for accompanying the children and all the parents who helped with transport.

Move Up Morning

The children all enjoyed the morning working with their new class on Wednesday morning. Changing classes always creates a mix of emotions, with the majority of children feeling both excitement and some anxiety, as is normal with any change. The children took part in a variety of different activities designed to help them get to know the new class and to address any worries or anxieties they may have. It was also lovely to welcome some new children to St Martin's on this day – they all went home after the experience very happy because of how welcome our children had made them feel.

Following some comments this week about Year 1 and Year 4 children either 'moving up' into the next class or 'staying down' in the same class, we just wanted to clarify the class system, to make things

clearer and to allay any concerns you may have. As a small school we have to have mixed age classes. We use a range of criteria when splitting the Year 1 and Year 4 children. We consider factors such as siblings, friendship groups and personality. The teachers use their professional judgement to split the children fairly between the two classes, considering what is in the best interests of all the children. We aim to have an equal ability split across the two classes - the children are not set. With the introduction of our new curriculum in September 2019, the children in both classes receive the same learning experiences – this has been carefully monitored by both the Senior Leadership Team and the Governors. Monitoring shows that not only are the children receiving the same learning experiences but the outcomes of the children in Year 2 and Year 5 this year have improved on last year, especially when looking at the percentage of children working at greater depth with age-related expectations. Please be aware that we talk to all the children about the fact that they are all 'moving up' into the next year group. The Year 1 and Year 4 children who are staying in Silver Birch and Maple are still moving up into Year 2 and Year 5 respectively and will be doing the same learning as those children in Year 2 and Year 5 in Sycamore and Willow.

A huge thank you to those children who are moving on from St Martin's at the end of this year, who spent Wednesday morning working in our nature area. They have cut back an amazing amount and the area is now much more useable. If anyone has a trailer and is able to help us dispose of the bits they have cut back, please talk to the school office – thank you!

Southsea Trip
