This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers. P.E. and school sport play a very important part in the life of St Martin's Primary School. We believe that P.E. and school sport contribute to the holistic development of our children and through participation, our children build and learn more about our key values such as respect, co-operation and kindness for themselves and others.

The sports premium funding of £8,000 plus £5.00 per pupil totalling £8,645 has been used to support the development of P.E. and school sport in the following ways:

- 1. Achieve the Gold Standard Active Mark for PE
- 2. Enable more pupils in all age groups to take part in competitive sport either interschool or intra-school competitions through half termly in-house key stage competitions and competitions across the pyramid of schools and wider area.
- 3. Provide quality assured professional development opportunities for teachers, enabling quality teaching and learning for all children. All staff now trained to use REAL PE in school.
- 4. To ensure high quality teaching and learning in all PE lessons through curriculum coaching through Schools Sports Network
- 5. Improve levels of physical activity during playtimes by improving equipment and resources, physical environment and staff training.

Our overall aim is to raise standards in P.E. and school sport, increasing the participation and opportunities offered to our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improved learning for all.

- More children are taking part in after school sports clubs than previously, with all of t sports clubs at full capacity since September, and registers showing healthy attendance.
- The additional funding has been used to train staff and purchase schemes of work to support the delivery of Real PE.
- The school has entered a higher number of sporting competitions with all pupils in years 1-6 having an opportunity to participate in inter-school sporting activities.

Future use of the sports grant 2017-2018

- To raise the profile of school and sports achievements in the local community and wider area through new noticeboard, newspaper reports of achievements and up to date website
- To purchase REAL PE assessment tool and implement clear and consistent assessment across the school
- To fund staff and provide resources for sensory circuits group at beginning of school day
- To encourage less active children to take part in physical activities through Huff and Puff lunchtime group and interschool activities aimed at the less competitive children.
- To replace old team kits and replace with new ones, suitable for all weathers and to fit Ks1 as well as KS2.
