Curriculum Conference

Last Friday Mrs Bartlett was invited to speak at the Hampshire Curriculum Conference for Headteachers. Following input from Bill Lucas (Professor of Learing at Winchester University) on the importance of a creative curriculum, Eric Halton (Country Education Officer for Hampshire County Council) on work being done across Hampshire on curriculum development and several HIAS inspectors on the Hampshire Curriculum Project group, Mrs Bartlett explained what we have done at St Martin's to review and develop our curriculum and shared our Curriculum Framework and Model. St Martin's was one of six schools asked to share their experience of curriculum review and development and it was really exciting to share the work we have done on our curriculum with other schools across Hampshire.
