Moderation - great news!

Every year Hampshire Local Authority randomly select about 25% of schools to moderate end of Key Stage teacher assessments. This year St Martin's was selected for EYFS and Year 6 moderation. The week before half term, Mrs Perry and Mrs Alexander spent the morning working with the EYFS moderator and this week Mrs Braidley spent an afternoon working with the Year 6 moderators. We are delighted to be able to share that all of our judgments were agreed and the moderators were incredibly impressed with the teachers in-depth, accurate and expert knowledge of the children in their class. As you know, we place great importance at St Martin's in knowing every child as an individual but it was lovely to have this acknowledged and identified as a strength by the external moderators as well.

As we reach the end of the academic year, we will be saying goodbye to several members of staff, all of which will be sorely missed.

We are delighted to be able to share that we have appointed Mrs Gerry Spatharis to the position of class teacher. Mrs Spatharis is an experienced teacher who has taught in a variety of different types of school but has a passion for small schools like St Martin's. She has also worked for the local authority and more recently run her own business providing support for children who find school difficult because of emotional and social difficulties. Mrs Spatharis will be visiting St Marin's over the next half term to get to know the school, the staff, the parents and most importantly the children. She will be at both move up sessions so the children in Willow class next year will have plenty of time to get to know her before September. Increase in Dinner Money costs

From September 2019, the cost of school dinners will be increasing from £2.30 to £2.40 for a two course, hot school meal. This is following the Executive Member for Children's Services Decision Day on 8th May. This revised charge reflects inflationary pressures associated with food costs and staff pay, which rose by 6.3% in April 2019, when the hourly pay rate for catering assistants was increased nationally.

Books

Can you help? We are currently looking to supplement the books we have in school for the children to read. As you are aware we raised money for new books earlier this year though our sponsored read and we are currently enjoying choosing what to spend this money on. Ideally we would like to ensure that every classroom has an age appropriate selection of books that the children can choose from, in addition to being allowed to borrow a book from the library.
