#### **Worship This Week**

We have been incredibly lucky to have two visitors talk to the children during whole school worship this week. As a school we have been thinking about hope for the future and things we can do to protect and look after God's world. On Monday Mrs Hunter spoke to the children about ecobricking and terracycling. The children are incredibly excited about both and we are currently investigating ways that the school can become more involved. On Thursday Mrs Coe (one of our school Governors) spoke to the children about her experience giving up plastic for lent. This year she has made a commitment during lent not to use any products that come in single-use plastics. Listening to her, it was incredible to think about the number of things we use on a daily basis that come packaged in plastic and the impact this has on the planet.

#### St Martin's Charity Collection Point

Your children may also have mentioned that as a school we are looking to collect things that can be recycled in order to support various charities. This is linked to our value of Hope, as we have been thinking about how we can help towards offering hope to others less fortunate than ourselves. So far we have decided to collect stamps for McMillian Cancer, foreign currency (coins or notes) or outdated currency for Bardardo's and ink cartridges for the British Heart Foundation. Mrs Rennison has also asked the children to think about any other small items we can collect for charity – it we can make the children's ideas work, we will. We are currently working out exactly how and where we are going to collect these items – watch this space for further information!
