Phonics Check

This week the children in Year 1 (and a few Year 2 children) have had a go at a practice phonics check. As you are aware the children in Year 1 complete a phonics screening test in June, which assesses if they have met the expected standard in phonics. Please be aware that at St Martin's our focus throughout the school is ensuring that all children receive high quality teaching and learning and not on 'teaching to the test.' If children receive high quality teaching they will achieve their potential in tests without us having to teach to the test. However children do need to experience going through the testing process before the actual event in order that they are prepared and understand the structure. With our younger children this is done is a very low key way. Your children are unlikely to have realised that they have completed a test - they are more likely to talk to you about reading some special words with Mrs Burke. The teachers will talk to you about your children's progress in phonics, including how they found this practice paper, at the parental consultation appointments at the end of this half term.

Ace Dance Club

Our new dance club received an unannounced visit from the team at Hampshire responsible for monitoring the provision of sports enrichments clubs in Hampshire. The visitor spent time checking that all correct checks had been undertaken by the school, that the dance instructor was appropriately qualified to lead the club and then spent time observing part of the session. When he fed back to Mrs Bartlett following the visit he was incredibly complimentary about the club. Please be aware that there are still spaces available for this club. Items from Home in School

Please can we remind all parents and carers that children should not be bringing toys or other items into school from home unless it has been agreed with their class teacher. We have recently had to deal with children becoming upset because of problems that have occurred because they have bought toys, cards, key rings and other items in from home. We have also had several of our older children bringing mobile phones into school. It is not appropriate for children to be using mobile phones in school time. If your child needs to bring a mobile phone to school because they are going somewhere other than home after school please can you leave it with the school office in the morning and they can collect it from the office when they are leaving school.

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend the School Association meeting on Tuesday evening. As you will see at the end of this newsletter there are some very exciting plans in place to help raise funds to benefit the children. Inclusion Manager Coffee Morning

Following the invite in the newsletter last week to meet the Mrs Turner, our new Inclusion Manager, at a coffee morning on Monday 28th January at 9:00am, we have been asked to explain what an Inclusion Manager is. Apologies – in education there are many terms and abbreviations that we forget are not in normal everyday use. Please always ask for explanations if we use terminology that you are unfamiliar with.

The role of Inclusion Manager within a school is vital. Mrs Turner is a member of the School Leadership Team with Mrs Bartlett and Mrs Rennison and will work alongside them to lead school development. Her role involves ensuring that all children at St Martin's have the support they need to be 'included' in learning and succeed in school. This includes children who have Special Educational Needs, children that are Looked After by the local authority or who have been Looked After in the past, children with English as an Additional Language or any child who has any additional needs. In order to ensure all children receive the support they need, Mrs Turner will spend her time liaising with outside agencies, talking to parents, carrying out diagnostic assessments with children and providing support and advice to school staff to ensure that all children are supported and enabled to succeed in school.


